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**Obligation to Register:**

You must register your dog/s before the dog/s reach the age of 12 weeks; immediately if an unregistered dog is purchased or otherwise acquired.

**All other dogs over the age of 12 weeks must be registered by 31st July 2011.**

**Owner:**

Section 2 Dog Control Act 1996 means every person who owns a dog or has the dog in their possession; or the parent or guardian of a person under 16 years.

**Offence of False Information:**

Section 41 Dog Control Act 1996. It is an offence, in making an application for the registration of a dog, to make any written statement knowing the statement to be false. On conviction the court may impose a fine up to \$1,500.

**Control of Dogs:**

Section 52 Dog Control Act 1996 states:

1. The owner of any dog shall keep that dog under control at all times.
2. Without limiting the generality of subsection (1) of this section, a dog shall for the purposes of this act be deemed to be not under control
  - a) if it is found at large on any land or premises other than a public place or private way without the consent (expressed or implied) of the occupier or person in charge of the land or premises; or
  - b) it is found at large in any public place or in any private way in contravention of any regulation or by-law.
3. Where a dog not under control in terms of subsection (2) of this section, the dog control officer or dog ranger may seize the dog and cause it to be returned to its owner or be impounded.

**Obligations of the Dog Owner:**

Section 54 Dog Control Act 1996:  
The owner of any dog must:

- a) Ensure that the dog receives proper care and attention and is supplied with proper and sufficient food, water and shelter; and
- b) Ensure that the dog receives adequate exercise.

You will commit an offence and be liable on conviction to imprisonment for up to 2 months or to a fine not exceeding \$5,000 if you fail to comply with this provision.

**Death of a Dog (Refund):**

Dog owners are entitled to a pro-rata refund on current registration on the death of their dog. The dog's registration tag or a vet certificate must be produced. The part fee refundable under this subsection shall be calculated on the basis of the number of complete months remaining in the registration year after date of the request for the refund.

**Microchipping of Dogs:**

From 1st July 2007, all dogs that are registered for the first time are required to have a microchip implanted.

Working dogs as defined under the Dog Control Act 1996 are exempt from microchipping.

The microchip must conform to the Dog Control (Microchip Transponder) Regulations 2005. (Copies are available on the Department of Internal Affairs; website: [www.dia.govt.nz](http://www.dia.govt.nz)). Some microchip scanners may only be able to read compliant microchips.

**Predominant Colour**

**Breed**

***If your dog is a pure breed:***

- This must be a breed recognised by the Council. The Council can supply you with a list of dog breeds to be used. If unsure, you may seek professional advice.

***If your dog is a cross breed:***

- The predominant breed must be recognised by the Council. The Council can supply you with a list of dog breeds to be used. If unsure, you may seek professional advice.
  
- The secondary breed must be recognised by the Council. The Council can supply you with a list of dog breeds to be used. If you do not know the secondary breed of the dog, you must put 'cross'.
