#### Submission:

The Ministry of Justice opposes the inclusion of the entire Courthouse building into the Schedule of Heritage Convenants under the proposed Kaipara District Plan Review.

The original courthouse building has been substantially altered over the years and now consists of one building after the 2003 extension. The building underwent significant modifications and thus diminishing the heritage integrity.

In addition, Ministry facilities often require modifications for evolving justice services, which a heritage convenant may delay or make building consents unnecessary more complex, thus timely and costly.

Where essential works (e.g. seismic remediation, emergency repairs) are delayed or blocked by heritage restrictions, this may disrupt court operations impacting the access to justice for the community.

The site is not listed as a heritage building on the Heritage NZ website, despite this the Ministry has undertaken sympathetic maintenance over the years in an attempt to retain the unique heritage characteristics of the building as displayed by the external paint palette.

### Relief sought

Removal of the whole Courthouse building from Schedule 1 Historic Heritage Resources of the Proposed Kaipara District Plan Review.
