Kaipara District Council (KDC) Proposed Rezoning of Oneriri Road Area

Submission on Proposed District Plan Change: Opposition to Rezoning of Oneriri Road.

We very strongly oppose the proposed rezoning of parts of Oneriri Road from Rural Zone to Rural Lifestyle Zone (RLZ).

This proposal is inappropriate for several reasons:

1. Inconsistent with RLZ Policy

RLZ is generally applied near townships with access to infrastructure and services.

Oneriri Road is approximately 10km from Kaiwaka, a narrow road in parts with a non-barriered railway line, a farm animal crossing, a one-way bridge that floods at times throughout the year, and subsidence everywhere with no plans for major remedial road works.

2. Junction of Oneriri Road and State Highway 1 (SH1)

This junction is a dangerous intersection going both ways. It is too near the bridge causing traffic to stop in a precarious position when turning right traveling south, tail gating is frequently a problem, or cars try to squeeze past while you are waiting to cross. Stock trucks attempting a right hand turn off Oneriri already inhibits traffic flow.

3. Inadequate Infrastructure

Kaiwaka village is sadly lacking in amenities, i.e. no police presence, no ambulance, no professional medical services, no chemist. Kaiwaka Primary School is full as is Otamatea College. A limited bus service, areas of limited Wi-Fi and radio reception, frequent power surges.

4. Conflict with Society Rules and Unjustified Rates Impact

Covenants at Takahoa Bay and Hinamoki restrict subdivision. Rezoning would push up property values and rates based on perceived development potential, unfairly penalising current residents. With many unsold sections already on the market, adding more supply in a low-demand area is unnecessary.

This is a working rural area, and where common sense prevails.

We urge Council to decline this proposal and retain the existing Rural Zoning.
