Reason for Full Opposition to: Maps/ General Rural Zone/ LOT1 DP 85708 BLK III OTAMATEA SD

The General Rural Zone does not reflect the current use of the property nor its size and close proximity to neighbours.

In addition, General Rural Zone is not included in LIZ-P3. This leaves (what is essentially a residential block of 5 houses) with reduced protection from the proposed adjoining/ adjacent Light Industrial Zone.

Reason for partial support of: Zones/ Light Industrial Zones/ LIZ-03

I agree that managing the effects at the Light Industrial Zone boundaries is crucial, however I don't believe that this objective can be achieved with the location of the proposed Light Industrial Zone on the North side of Kaiwaka.

The (Waka Kotahi-owned) access way directly in front of LOT 2 DP 40591 provides vehicle access to 5 houses and a farm. This entry/ exit point is perilous at the best of times.

It is situated below a sharp blind corner to the north; in the middle of a passing lane; in a 100km/h speed zone and; poorly maintained by Waka Kotahi (maintenance is non-existent) meaning there is loose gravel on top of tarseal right at the entry/exit, often causing a loss of traction upon exit.

The addition of more driveways/ access ways (and large industrial vehicles pulling in and out) to contend with in this area, will cost lives.

Reason for partial support of: Zones/ Light Industrial Zones/ LIZ-P3

Maintaining the interface of the adjoining zone is very important to me as a resident and taxpayer in an adjacent zone (LOT 1 DP 85708 BLK III OTAMATEA SD).

However I feel that the proposed location of the Light Industrial Zone will not maintain the natural characteristics (refer to *amenity value* definition in LIZ-P3) of the area surrounding my home (refer to *sensitive activities- b)residential activity* in LIZ-P3).

Fields and trees will be replaced with: concrete, tarseal, metal; structures and buildings that are poitentially up to 15 metres high (Refer to LIZ-S1).

Buildings are of particular concern as part of the relevant land (directly opposite the road from my property) is significantly higher than the land my property is on.

Not only will buildings and industry replace our peaceful, rural outlook, but these will sit significantly higher than my property, making it difficult to block out the view of these buildings (even with the addition of fences or tall plantings to my property).

Also of concern is the lack of any sort of visual/ spatial buffer between the Light Industrial Zone and LOT 2 DP 40591. This will create another eye-sore from my property and will therefore not maintain the natural characteristics of adjoining zones.

Reason for partial support of: Strategic Direction/ Vision for Kaipara/ SD-VK-O1

I absolutely agree that wellbeing must be at the heart of any planning decisions made. However, I am particularly concerned about how the proposed location of the Light Industrial Zone in Kaiwaka will have a detrimental effect on the people (particularly our tamariki and rangatahi) of Kaiwaka.

It seems that with the shifting location (now confirmed) of the Northland Corridor to the East of Kaiwaka (rather than to the West as was originally envisioned) there was a chance to adapt our vision as to what this might mean for Kaiwaka. It is disappointing that this seems to have had no bearing on the proposed location of the Light Industrial Zone in Kaiwaka. As a parent I'm concerned for my children's safety and wellbeing.

We will now be in a situation where industrial vehicles will be leaving the Northland Corridor at an interchange presumably somewhere East of Kaiwaka then travelling along Kaiwaka-Mangawhai Road (a road that is already key to our local children's bus routes) to the Light Industrial Zone. They will need to go directly past: the local Primary school; an early childhood centre; a popular Playground and; the local Four Square shop- popular with local high school students (as they disembark their school bus right outside).

I fail to see how increased (industrial) traffic along this portion of Kaiwaka- Mangawhai road ensures the wellbeing of our tamariki and rangatahi. Their safety has not been prioritised. Moving the Light Industrial Zone closer to the east/ towards the Northland Corridor makes more sense and I'm really surprised that this was overlooked.
