Submission:

I oppose the Site Specific Controls that apply to 28 Bush Lane, Mangawhai being the Mangawhai/Hakaru Managed Growth Area.

The calling out of this specific area seems to be against the National Policy Statement for urban growth and is not allowing for the growth of Mangawhai in an area close to the township & amenties. It seems thus Managed growth areas is in fact a uneccesary constraining of growth. As the Mangawhai heads are can grow outwards East (where it is the sea) it can only grow West, which is where the managed growth area is, and is what my property is located within the proposed area.

Specifically relating to the end of King road Area, the current plan allowing sites to be sunbivided down to 4,000sqm means there is now more affordable & accessible lifestyle properties, and the area has a mix of Olive groves, Vineyards, Farm shops, Rural Farmstays, Art Galleries, Cooking schools and so on. This is a unique tourist attraction to Mangawhai and one where the council should be encouraging growth, not specifically restriciting it.
