I generally support the submission. With regards minimum allotment size currently set at 4000 m², I have seen a few submissions providing differing minimum lot sizes. I was going to say nothing and just let it finish up where it lands. But I would like to make the following comments regarding minimum allotment sizes. The rural residential zone is generally best located alongside settlements or where the development pattern is already consisting of lots that are generally smaller than those found in the general rural zone. A minimum area should be treated as being the smallest you can go, except in a situation that is truly unique, in which case the matter should be dealt with as a non-complying activity, and be approved or declined on its merits.

In designing subdivision, there are a number of elements that need to be considered and weighed against each other. It is not a flat piece of paper exercise to fit as many minimum sized lots together as possible, like a tetris puzzle. There is usually a ranking and a compromise to get a best fit of the weighting of the various elements which best suit the land

involved and its setting. Some key controlling factors (by no means the only ones, or the most important in all situations), are geotechnical site suitability, access, presence of hazards such as flooding or stability, aspect, outlook, location of other houses and the surrounding development pattern. More often than not I find that it is not possible to create minimum sized lots, and often we finish up with a variety of Lot sizes.

It would be my preference as a professional tasked with designing and seeing new properties developed to keep the minimum lot size as proposed.

The submitter has given this good thinking. I think that it is proposed to restrict permitted activity home occupations to ensure that the general rural zone does not become a de facto commercial or industrial area.

I think that it should not restrict what can occur with legitimate rural activities. Many farms employ staff who do not live on the land. The restriction to limit to 2 is unlikely to be an enforceable thing if I was to use the permitted baseline argument. All this would do would be to create time delay & cost for a party who is looking to boost employment. Many farms have more than 2 heavy vehicle trips to the site per week. Provided the access points to the operation are properly set up for appropriate vehicle tracking, parking and maneuvering, there should be no distinction for a home occupation from what can occur on a farm. The restriction as to the commercial vehicle is also too restrictive. Farms do not have a restriction like this.

Farms are not restricted to selling goods that are solely produced on that farm (as far as I am aware). A home occupation should not have a restriction that is not applied to standard farming activities.

The restrictions should deal with things that are unique to the zone.
