The existing council-managed wastewater treatment pond in Kaiwaka is degraded and no longer fit for purpose. It lacks the capacity and resilience to manage current flows, let alone the increased load anticipated from proposed zoning changes. The Plan's omission of any infrastructure upgrade contradicts its own growth objectives and exposes the community to escalating environmental and health risks. Climate change is intensifying rainfall and flooding events, leading to frequent overflows and leakage from the treatment pond into the Kaiwaka River. This contamination poses serious risks to ecosystems, public health and Māori cultural values. The Proposed District Plan promotes higher-density residential and commercial development in Kaiwaka's town centre, yet fails to provide for the infrastructure necessary to support this growth. This disconnect undermines the principles of integrated planning and sustainable development. While a full upgrade is staged in the Long-Term Plan, the District Plan should enable interim, scalable solutions that reduce environmental harm and build resilience. Including constructed wetlands, decentralised anaerobic digestion systems, community scale modular treatment units.

The plan must map SNA now, otherwise the Plan may not be appropriately drafted to achieve the outcomes of the NPS IB. All plan provisions need to be considered holistically, and the interrelationships between provisions assessed to ensure that the mapping and related provisions work together to achieve required outcomes.

Potential wording could be: Objective SD-XX-OX Balancing Productive Use and Amenity Values The use and development of land and resources are managed in a way that: 1. supports the efficient and productive use of land and resources; and 2. recognises and provides for the community's ability to enjoy the natural environment, including its open spaces, landscape character, and amenity values; so that a fair and enduring balance is achieved between environmental protection, economic opportunity, and social wellbeing, for the benefit of both current and future generations. OR Wording with similar intent and effect. AND Any consequential amendments.	The submitter supports the inclusion of an objective that deals with managing the potential conflicts between enabling primary production in rural areas, and the protection of natural character, landscapes, features and ecosystems.

The submitter supports an indigenous biodiversity objective being included but is concerned with the use of "or" within the provision. "Or" indicates an option, i.e., that only one of the outcomes is sufficient. It is requested that "or" is replaced with "and" to ensure the intent behind SD-NE-O1 is not undermined and to provide clarity regarding the outcomes sought. The submitter also considers that the objective should list the things that contribute to indigenous biodiversity and include those activities from which indigenous biodiversity should be protected.

The submitter has sought this relief without limiting the scope of the submission on the details in other Proposed District Plan chapters or maps.

Section 7(f) requires particular regard to be given by Council to the maintenance and enhancement of the environment. NPS-FM and NZCPS seek the management of freshwater to ensure the health and wellbeing of freshwater waterbodies and ecosystems. Moreover, Policy 14 of the NZCPS requires that Councils promote the restoration or rehabilitation of natural character within the coastal environment. As proposed, SD-NE-O2 only mentions preservation and protection. The submitter requests that this objective is amended in order to give effect to s6 and 7 of the Resource Management Act and relevant NPS.
