**Decision (On The Papers)**

This is for an application by Craig Mitchell on behalf of the Kauri Lands Skill Centre for a Special Licence in respect of premises situated at Wharf Road, Ruawai, Kaipara District and known as Ruawai Tokatoka War Memorial Hall. The application is for the Silver Jubilee of the Kauri Lands Skill Centre to be held on 21 March 2015.

This application was made under section 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and is being determined by the District Licensing Committee under section 191(2).

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment.

No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the applicant.



We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in section 142 of the Act and we grant the applicant a Special Licence.

Alcohol may be sold under the Licence only on the following days and during the following hours:

· **Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> March 2015 from 6.00pm to 11.00pm**

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- a) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when liquor may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- b) A variety of substantial foods shall be available as detailed by the applicant for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale and supply of alcohol. The range of food will include meat filled bread rolls, five varieties of club sandwiches, toasted panini's, assorted pizza slices, cocktail sausages as well as a range of other finger foods.
- c) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as follows:  
At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, low-alcohol beverages of the nature stated on the application form shall be available for consumption.  
Drinking water must be readily available and free of charge.
- d) The steps detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the licensed premises.
- e) The steps as detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- f) The following steps shall be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:  
The Manager/s to be on duty at all times. Host responsibility techniques to be applied to ensure no intoxication. No sale of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons allowed.
- g) Members of the public shall be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances:  
If an intoxicated or otherwise prohibited person under the Act.



- h) Alcohol may only be served in the following containers:

All refreshments shall be served in standard single serve glassware as supplied by the premises for beer or wine. Alternatively beer or pre-mix RTD's may be supplied in single serve cans or 330ml bottles.
