

## **Special Licence (for Premises)**

Sections 22 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 Schedule 12, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Regulations 2013

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

is authorised to sell and supply alcohol for consumption on the premises situated at 14 Gibbons Road, Kaiwaka, Kaipara District and known as the Kaiwaka Sports Complex, to any person attending the following occasions or events:

#### Conditions

a) Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:

# Saturday 05 December 2015 from 5.00pm to 12.00 midnight Saturday 12 March 2016 from 6.00pm to 1.00am the following day

- b) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- c) A variety of substantial foods shall be available as detailed by the applicant for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale and supply of alcohol. The range of food will include a selection of meats, breads, vegetables and salads. A choice of desserts will also be provided.
- d) Low-alcohol beverages of the nature stated on the application form, must be available for sale and supply on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol.

- e) Drinking water be freely available to all customers at all times that the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol. 'Freely available' to customers, in relation to water, means -
  - (i) Supplied free in clean drinking vessels on request; or
  - (ii) Available free in larger containers from which it may be easily poured or drawn by customers, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby; or
  - (iii) Available free from a tap to which customers have easy access, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby.
- f) The steps detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the licensed premises.
- g) The steps as detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- h) The following steps shall be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
  - The Managers to be on duty at all times.
  - Host responsibility techniques to be applied to ensure no intoxication.
  - No sale of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons allowed.
- i) Members of the public shall be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances:
  - If an intoxicated or otherwise prohibited person under the Act.
- j) Alcohol may only be served in the following containers:
  - Beer shall be by way of single serve 330ml and 750ml bottles.
  - Wine shall be by way of single serve glassware as supplied by the premises.
  - Spirits shall be by way of single serve glassware as supplied by the premises.
  - Premixes and RTD's shall be by way of 330ml bottles.





### Duration

This licence is in force on the date and between the times listed in Condition a).

Warning: The licensee is warned that the issue of this licence does not remove any obligation to comply with the provisions of the Resource Management Act 1991 or any other applicable legislation.
