**Decision (On the Papers)**

This is for an application by Richard James Anderson on behalf of the Dargaville Rugby and Sports Club for a Special licence in respect of premises situated at 33 Awakino Point East Road, Dargaville, Kaipara District and known as the Food Hall Garden Bar. The application is for the Northland Field Days to be held on Thursday 03 March 2016, Friday 04 March 2016, and Saturday 05 March 2016 from 11.00am until 10.00pm all dates inclusive.

This application was made under section 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and is being determined by the District Licencing Committee under section 191(2).

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment.

No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the application.



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We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and we grant the applicant a Special Licence.

In addition to Richard James Anderson and Ian Neil Condon as Managers for the event, we also appoint under s.213(2) of the Act, Tim Webster, David Webster, Annette Sweeney and Ray Snooks as a responsible persons for the duration of the event.

Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:

- **Thursday 03 March 2016 from 11.00am to 10.00pm.**
- **Friday 04 March 2016 from 11.00am to 10.00pm.**
- **Saturday 05 March 2016 from 11.00am until 10.00pm.**

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- a) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- b) A variety of substantial foods shall be available as detailed by the applicant for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale and supply of alcohol. The range of food will include a selection of sandwiches, filled rolls, cakes, pies, hot steak sandwiches, bacon and egg sandwiches, hot chips, kumara chips, all day breakfasts and from 5.00pm dinner meals with a choice of steak, ham steak, chicken or fish with salads and hot chips and a selection of desserts to be available.
- c) Low-alcohol beverages of the nature stated on the application form, must be available for sale and supply on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol.
- d) Drinking water be freely available to all customers at all times that the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol. 'Freely available' to customers, in relation to water, means -
  - (i) *Supplied free in clean drinking vessels on request; or*
  - (ii) *Available free in larger containers from which it may be easily poured or drawn by customers, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby; or*
  - (iii) *Available free from a tap to which customers have easy access, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby.*



- e) The steps detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the licensed premises.
- f) The steps as detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- g) The following steps shall be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
  - At least one certified Manager or responsible person to be rostered on duty at all times.
  - Host responsibility techniques to be applied to ensure no intoxication.
  - No sale of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons allowed.
- h) Members of the public shall be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances:
  - If an intoxicated or otherwise prohibited person under the Act.
- i) Alcohol may only be served in the following containers:
  - Beer shall be by way of single serve 330ml bottles and glassware as supplied by the premises.
  - Wine shall be by way of single serve 187ml bottles and glassware as supplied by the premises.
  - Pre-mixes/RTD's and Spirits shall be by way of single serve 330ml bottles and glassware as supplied by the premises.
