Decision (On the Papers)

This is for an application by Helen Patricia Whyte on behalf of Mangawhai Walking Weekend Charitable Trust for a special licence in respect of premises situated at 35 Insley Street, Mangawhai, Kaipara District and known as The Olive Grove. The application is made in respect of an event described as the Mangawhai Food and Wine Festival to be held on Saturday 25 March 2017, from 3.00 pm to 7.30 pm.

This application was made under section 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and is being determined by the District Licencing Committee under section 191 (2).

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment. No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the application.

Gary Cameron, Elizabeth Cameron, Nicola Deveraux, Jenny Millar and Ross Millar shall be appointed to manage the event in accordance with section 213 (1) of the Act.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and we grant the applicant a special Licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

a) Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:

Saturday 25 March 2017, from 3.00 pm to 7.30 pm

- b) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- c) A variety of substantial foods shall be available as detailed by the applicant for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale and supply of alcohol. The range of food will include BBQ meats, burgers, sliders, kebabs, pizza, mussel fritters, sandwiches, Japanese food and Mexican food.
- d) Low-alcohol beverages of the nature stated on the application form, must be available for sale and supply on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol.
- e) Potable drinking water is to be freely available to all customers at all times that the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol. 'Freely available' to customers, in relation to water, means
 - i. Supplied free in clean drinking vessels on request; or
 - Available free in larger containers from which it may be easily poured or drawn by customers, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby; or
 - iii. Available free from a tap to which customers have easy access, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby.
- f) The steps detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the licensed premises.
- g) The steps as detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol.





- h) The following steps shall be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - One manager to be on duty at all times at each point of sale.
 - Host responsibility techniques to be applied to ensure no intoxication.
 - iii. No sale of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons allowed.
- i) Members of the public shall be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances:
 - i. If an intoxicated or otherwise prohibited person under the Act.
- j) Alcohol may only be served in the following containers:
 - Beer shall be by way of single serve 330 ml and 500 ml cans.
 - ii. Wine shall be by way of single serve 150 ml glass and 750 ml shared bottles.
