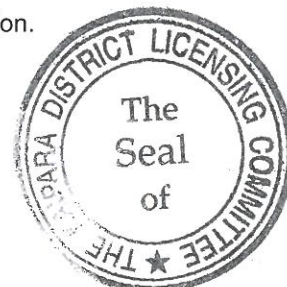

Decision (On the Papers)

This is for an application by Malcolm Henry Barnes on behalf of Northern Wairoa Boating Club Incorporated or a special licence in respect of premises situated at 21 Totara Street, Dargaville, Kaipara District and known as the Northern Wairoa Boating Club. The application is made in respect of two events described as Dargaville High School 70th Reunion to be held on Saturday 22 October 2016 from 11.00am to 1.00am the following day and to those people attending the Band Night on Saturday 29 October 2016 from 4.00pm to 1.00am the following day. This application was made under section 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and is being determined by the District Licensing Committee under section 191(2).

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment. No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the application.



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In addition to Malcolm Henry Barnes and Jeanette Maria Cavell as Managers for the event, we also appoint under s.213(2) of the Act, Rodney Wilson and Scott Curel as responsible persons for the events.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and we grant the applicant a special Licence.

Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:

- **Saturday 22 October 2016 from 11.00am to 1.00am the following day.**
- **Saturday 29 October 2016 from 4.00pm to 1.00am the following day.**

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- a) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- b) A variety of substantial foods shall be available as detailed by the applicant for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale and supply of alcohol. The range of food will include a selection of roast meats, roast vegetables, a variety of salads, a range of desserts, burgers, chips, sausages and toasted sandwiches.
- c) Low-alcohol beverages of the nature stated on the application form, must be available for sale and supply on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol.
- d) Drinking water be freely available to all customers at all times that the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol. 'Freely available' to customers, in relation to water, means -
 - (i) *Supplied free in clean drinking vessels on request; or*
 - (ii) *Available free in larger containers from which it may be easily poured or drawn by customers, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby; or*
 - (iii) *Available free from a tap to which customers have easy access, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby.*
- e) The steps detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the licensed premises.
- f) The steps as detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol.



- g) The following steps shall be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
- At least one Manager to be on duty at all times.
 - Host responsibility techniques to be applied to ensure no intoxication.
 - No sale of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons allowed.
- h) Members of the public shall be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances:
- If an intoxicated or otherwise prohibited person under the Act.
- i) Alcohol may only be served in the following containers:
- Beer shall be by way of single serve 330ml bottles, 400 ml handles and 750 ml bottles.
 - Wine shall be by way of single serve 200ml glassware as provided by the premises.
 - Premix and RTD's shall be by way of single serve 330ml bottles.
 - Spirits be way of single serve 200ml glasses or 400ml glasses as supplied by the premises.
