

Decision No. **SP1820-2017**

of an application by **Mangawhai Museum and Historical Society Incorporated** for a special licence pursuant to s.142 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 191 Molesworth Drive Mangawhai Kaipara District known as "Mangawhai Museum".

DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is for an application by Mangawhai Museum and Historical Society Incorporated for a special licence in respect of premises situated at 191 Molesworth Drive Mangawhai and known as Mangawhai Museum. The application is made in respect of an event or occasion described as a Piano Concert.

This application was made under section 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and is being determined by the District Licensing Committee under section 191(2).

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment. No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the application.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence.

The special licence 03/SP/1820/2017 will be subject to the following conditions:

- a) Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:
Sunday 05 November 2017 from 4.00 pm to 7.00 pm.
- b) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- c) A minimum of three substantial food options shall be available at all times that the special licence is in force. The range of food shall be similar to that shown on any menu submitted or a range of food in the nature of pies, sandwiches, filled rolls, pizza and the like.
- d) Low-alcohol beverages of the nature stated on the application form, must be available for sale and supply on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol.



- e) Drinking water be freely available to all customers at all times that the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol. 'Freely available' to customers, in relation to water, means -
 - (i) Supplied free in clean drinking vessels on request; or
 - (ii) Available free in larger containers from which it may be easily poured or drawn by customers, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby; or
 - (iii) Available free from a tap to which customers have easy access, together with clean drinking vessels that are also available free nearby.
- f) The steps detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the licensed premises.
- g) The steps as detailed in the application form must be taken by the licensee to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- h) The following steps shall be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - i. One named certified manager to be on duty at all times;
 - ii. Host responsibility techniques to be applied to ensure no intoxication;
 - iii. No sale of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons allowed.
- i) Members of the public shall be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances:
 - i. If an intoxicated or otherwise prohibited person under the Act.
- j) Alcohol may only be served in the following containers:
 - i. Beer shall be by way of single serve cans;
 - ii. Wine shall be by way of single serve glassware;
- k) The entire area is designated as a supervised area.
