### **Summary**

The NDHB and the Cancer Society have advocated to Council to further develop our Smokefree Policy in order to strengthen our position and priorities. This ensures the district continues to work towards healthy and resilient communities and increases its reputation as an appealing destination. Council Officers have been working collaboratively with the NDHB and the Cancer Society to review and make recommendations to Council on a revised Smokefree Kaipara Policy (the 'Policy').

The Policy was reviewed with Council agreeing to the new and revised Policy direction at its August 2018 meeting. It was also agreed at that meeting that Council should seek public feedback on the draft Policy. Council delegated the responsibility to Councillors Curnow, Joyce-Paki and Wethey to hear and make recommendations. The recommendation is required to obtain a final resolution at a full Council meeting.

Feedback was sought from the community from 01 to 31 October 2018. During this time, Council received feedback from 66 individuals and organisations, **Attachment 1**. Generally, the direction in the Policy was well received, albeit with a diverse range of preferred smokefree areas. **Attachment 2** contains the summary of the feedback and **Attachment 3** the draft Policy amended as per the Officer recommendation.

#### Recommendation

That the Smokefree Kaipara Policy Panel:

- 1 Receives the Policy Planner's report 'Deliberations on Smokefree Kaipara Policy' dated 08 November 2018 and its Attachments 1, 2 and 3; and
- 2 Believes it has complied with the decision-making provisions of the Local Government Act 2002 to the extent necessary in relation to this decision; and in accordance with the provision of s79 of the Act determines that it does not require further information prior to making a decision on this matter; and
- Recommends to Council to adopt the Policy as consulted, with an amendment to Part 5 item 5 (page 2, paragraph 3) to read '5 Inside social housing' instead of '5 Social housing'.



#### Reason for the recommendation

The feedback received generally supports the proposed Policy direction, including some of the additional public areas Council seeks to be smokefree.

### Reason for the report

To provide Council with information on community sentiment for the Policy and support consequential deliberations.

### **Background**

Council was first approached by the NDHB in 2008 as part of the Annual Plan 2008/2009 consultation round. Their request was for Council to consider a Smokefree Policy at all Council-owned parks and playgrounds. At this time, the Council implemented an educative smokefree approach to all 12 Council-administered playgrounds within the district. In November 2011, Council introduced an educative Smokefree Policy and extended the Policy to cover 10 Council-owned parks, sports fields and swimming pools from September 2012.

The NDHB and the Cancer Society worked collaboratively to support Council to implement the Policy. The purpose of the Policy was to provide smokefree role models for our children and show them that smoking is not a 'normal' part of life. The main action taken was to erect smokefree signage at Council playgrounds. No Policy was adopted until 2011.

On 30 June 2015, Council signed a Statement of Intent to Support Tupeka Kore Smokefree Tai Tokerau 2025. This Statement has the vision that:

'Our children and mokopuna will be free from tobacco/smoke and enjoy tobacco/smokefree lives. At least 95% of the Tai Tokerau population will be smokefree. Tobacco will be expensive to purchase and difficult to access.'

In many cases smokefree policies have been successful. The NDHB has advised that there has been a consistently high level of compliance and very little resistance.

A submission was made to Council's Long Term Plan 2018/2028 process by Patu Puauahi Tai Tokerau. They represent a group of organisations all working within the Tobacco Control sector in Northland. This group includes the NDHB and the Cancer Society. The following is a summary of key information contained within the submission. Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable death and disease in New Zealand, accounting for around 4,300 to 4,700 deaths per year. When the deaths caused from exposure to second-hand smoke are included, this estimate increases to around 5,000 deaths per year. Smoking causes a quarter of all cancer deaths. Disease as a result of smoking has further impacts on environmental, social, economic and cultural well-beings of those affected and of those around them as well as the country's health sector.

The NDHB and the Cancer Society have advocated to Council to further develop our Smokefree Policy in order to strengthen our position and priorities. This ensures the district continues to work towards healthy and resilient communities and increases its reputation as an appealing destination. Council Officers have been working collaboratively with the NDHB and the Cancer Society to review and make recommendations to Council on a revised Smokefree Kaipara Policy.



#### Issues

It is proposed to apply the Policy areas to e-cigarettes and other similar devises (i.e. no smoking or vaping), **Attachment 3**. It is also proposed to apply the Policy to the following Council facilities and agreements.

- Council-owned or managed parks, playgrounds, sports fields, reserves and skate parks;
- Swimming pool complexes;
- · Bus and taxi shelters;
- Beaches;
- Social housing;
- All Council-owned buildings and facilities including within four metres of their entranceways, openings and any surrounding outdoor public areas;
- All contractual agreements to hire Council-owned facilities or equipment use to be smokefree and vape-free;
- · Council funded, run and supported events will be smokefree and vape-free.
- Outdoor pavement dining areas;
- Council will also investigate designating areas in town centres as smokefree and vape-free.

An Action Plan has also been included in the Policy to help give direction on the types of activities that will be undertaken to give effect to the revised Policy. These actions are categorised into three areas:

- 1 Communication, engagement, and monitoring.
- 2 Smokefree and vape-free areas and events.
- 3 Cessation support.

### **Consultation process**

The NDHB and the Cancer Society had previously undertaken consultation with the Kaipara communities by way of a survey online and in person in October/November 2017. Over 650 Kaipara residents responded with:

- 73% showing wide support for increased smokefree outdoor spaces;
- 69% showing support for smokefree areas outside all public buildings and facilities owned by KDC:
- 69% showing support for smokefree pedestrian areas within town centres;
- 62% showing support for smokefree areas on all public lands owned by KDC;
- 71% showing support for smokefree outdoor dining areas;
- 48% showing support for smokefree beaches.

In summary consultation with the Kaipara community by the NDHB has shown widespread support for increased smokefree outdoor public spaces.

Council has undertaken consultation in accordance with Council's Significance and Engagement Policy. Feedback was received from 66 individuals and organisations (see **Attachment 1** for full feedback responses). The results of the consultation showed similar results to the NDHB and Cancer Society's findings (see summary of responses in **Attachment 2**) in that:

- 95 % showing wide support for playgrounds;
- 84 % showing wide support for parks;



- 73 % showing wide support for reserves;
- 84 % showing wide support for sports fields;
- 87 % showing wide support for skate parks;
- 97 % showing wide support for swimming pool complexes;
- 43 % showing wide support for beaches;
- 75 % showing wide support for around transport hubs e.g. bus and taxi shelters;
- 59 % showing wide support for Council-owned social housing;
- 73 % showing wide support for outside all Council-owned buildings and facilities including within four metres of their entranceways, openings and any surrounding outdoor public areas;
- 70 % showing wide support for outdoor pavement dining areas;
- 65% showing wide support for Council to investigate designating areas in town centres as smokefree and vape-free;
- · 38% showing that they would like outdoor dining to be compulsory smokefree.

A response from Hospitality New Zealand has fallen outside of the questions asked within the feedback period. They have expressed their concerns around implementing an outdoor dining policy and would like to be involved and work with Council when implementing this part of the Policy.

### **Social Housing**

Another concern from a couple of submissions are around the banning of smoking in social housing. The current Policy is already that these are smokefree, in terms of smoking inside. The Policy will extend this to the outside of the units. Submitter concerns are that this might disadvantage whanau who smoke and may affect their ability to obtain social housing.

Social housing could be considered as a private residence and may be seen to be a burden on people's rights if the Policy is to be applied both inside and outside of the building. As such, rewording to clarify that the Policy refers to inside of social housing and not to outside of social housing buildings would be considered more reasonable.

### **Beaches**

A low number of response 43% indicated they want the Policy to be applied to beaches. The practicalities of applying the Policy to beaches should be considered, given that one beach is over 100km long, in which case it may not be feasible to apply the Policy to beaches. If beaches were to be included the area that it includes should be considered and defined e.g. within 500m around a beach entrance and stipulate the beach accesses that it involves. This would better target the non-smoking area without being overly burdensome when trying to implement the Policy.

### **Outdoor Pavement Dining**

One of the key questions was asked if it should be compulsory to not smoke on outdoor pavement areas. The feedback has shown that approximately 70% think it should be smokefree however only 38% think it should be compulsory.

One of the key actions proposed within the Policy is to work with restaurant and café business owners, to designate outdoor dining, and waiting areas to become smokefree on a voluntary basis. It is believed given the number of outdoor dining areas within the district this is still the best approach to take.



Other options to address outdoor dining on the pavement, include to either construct an Alfresco Dining (outdoor pavement dining) Policy or address this matter through a bylaw. A Policy would provide a framework for the development, management and control of alfresco dining. The Policy would be implemented when people seek permission to use the footpath to provide alfresco dining. This would not provide for any direct enforcement, and will involve working with the businesses involved.

A bylaw would have enforcement mechanisms available should people decided to smoke when seated at an alfresco dining area. A bylaw could be set up to also provide a framework for Council to resolve areas to be non-smoking, including alfresco dining areas, or town centres where most alfresco dining areas are likely to be situated.

### **Neighbouring Councils**

The information below shows that the draft Policy is generally consistent to the Whangarei District Council and the Auckland Council in terms of where the Policy should apply and how the Policy is implemented.

### Far North District Council

The Smokefree Parks and Playgrounds, and Reserves was last reviewed in 2016 and covers Parks and Playgrounds, and Reserves only. Implemented through appropriate signage. This was first introduced in 2012.

### Whangarei District Council

At their 25 October 2018 Council meeting the Whangarei District Council resolved to update their Smokefree Policy. Whangarei introduced a Smokefree Policy for its playgrounds and sports grounds in 2010, followed by its parks in 2011. The term smokefree also includes vaping (electronic cigarettes) and the use of heated tobacco products (HTP). All Whangarei bus shelters and the Rose Street transport hub became Smokefree in February 2014. Other key city spaces such as the Aquatic Centre, Te Manawa The Hub Information Centre, the I-site at Tarewa Park, Central City Car Park, Clapham's Clocks, Quarry Gardens and Kiwi North are also smokefree.

The current update to the Whangarei District Smokefree Policy is now working towards making the following smokefree:

- Whangarei District Council owned property and land;
- · Events that are sponsored, funded or run by Whangarei District Council;
- Publicly accessible beaches.

It is considered to be a non-regulatory Policy with outcomes being achieved through educational signage, lease agreements and through contracts/agreements for events run, funded or sponsored by the Whangarei District Council.

### Auckland Council

Auckland Council has a Smokefree Policy 2017-2025 which identifies areas where the Auckland Council has responsibilities and the best way to make Auckland a smokefree city by 2025. They do not define smoking and appears to only apply to tobacco products (cigarettes) and not vaping or HTP.



Currently the Auckland smokefree areas include, all parks and reserves, playgrounds, skateparks, sports fields, transport hubs, outdoor areas associated with the Council (such as libraries, stadiums, museums and the zoo to name a few).

From November 2017 public areas to be rolled out are:

- plazas, civic squares, shared spaces, urban centres;
- the areas around sports clubs on council land;
- · alfresco dining areas;
- common areas of council housing;
- beaches.

The policy aims to improve the health and well-being of Auckland's communities by:

- reducing the prevalence of smoking;
- de-normalising smoking behaviour;
- providing people with public places that are free of cigarette smoke.

It does not propose to ban smoking. The Policy has been promoted through education and awareness, and uses signage and other forms of communication, with the success of the Smokefree Policy relying on social pressure to comply.

#### Factors to consider

### Community views

The consultation that was undertaken on the draft Policy has enabled Council to gain public feedback. Council can now consider community views prior to making a decision on the final Policy.

### **Policy implications**

When adopted by Council the Policy will be a guiding document on how Council views smoking in Public places. The final Policy may be incorporated into Council's Reserve and Open Spaces Strategy and Reserve Management Plans when they are next reviewed. Adopting this Policy also fulfils a national and Northland-wide commitment to improve the health and well-being of the district's resident children and youth.

### Financial implications

There are no major financial implications. Resources to implement the proposed Policy actions will largely come from external organisations, with some minor budget allocation from existing operational budgets. Council Officer time will be the main resource required by Council.

### Legal/delegation implications

There are no legal/delegation implications.

### **Options**

Option A: Adopt the proposed amended Policy.

Option B: Adopt the proposed Policy with amended changes to reflect community feedback on the amended draft Policy.

Option C: Do not amend or extend the current Policy.



### **Assessment of options**

Option A: This option reflects the sentiment of Kaipara communities as per the survey and research conducted by the NDHB and the Cancer Society. It presents Kaipara District Council as taking a leadership role or being proactive on health issues or policies. It will increase our reputation as a thriving Kaipara. This provides Council with an opportunity to remain a leader in this space by including vape-free areas and extending smokefree areas to physical spaces and our contractual agreements, showing a strong commitment to our communities' well-being, especially the younger and future generations.

Option B: Feedback received shows diversity and not all community views provided to support the draft Policy as currently written. Supporting some amended changes illustrates Council takes community views seriously. It is proposed to amend the Policy to refer to the inside of social housing to clarify and address the concerns within some of the submissions that people may be adversely affected if applied to the outside of the buildings. This option however may be seen to slow down the adoption rate compared to what other councils are promoting and will require ongoing resources to keep progressing national and Northland preferred Policy direction.

Option C: This option shows some progress but does not fully consider an increasing health issue prevalent amongst youth. It does not present Kaipara District Council as taking a leadership role in the absence of clear legislative direction from central government.

### Assessment of significance

The proposed Policy may affect how people use the district's public places and therefore the communities are likely to have an interest in the proposed Policy. Accordingly, the Policy has sought feedback from the community.

### Recommended option

The recommended option is Option B as it is considered the most appropriate mechanism to address health issues related to smoking prevalent in Kaipara and throughout Northland. It also shows a dedicated commitment to the Tupeka Kore Smokefree Tai Tokerau 2025 vision and addresses concerns raised from feedback received.

### **Next step**

Provide Council with the Hearing Panel's recommendation on the Smokefree Kaipara Policy.

Established as a Tripartite agreement between Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua, Tainui and ngā Mātāwaka (Te Whānau o Waipareira) to broker health contracts for the benefit of iwi Māori living within Tāmaki Mākaurau, Hāpai supports actions that uplifts the health and well-being of Māori in alignment with the rights and principles guaranteed to Māori with Te Tiriti o Waitangi.

The proposed policy presents some contentious issues regarding the current space that we are asked to navigate in our aspirations towards a Smokefree Aotearoa 2025, and in principal, we support the overarching goals, as we too, have the broad goal of seeing a smokefree Aotearoa, particularly given the inequitable distribution of smoking across the Maori population, as well as the incidental impacts of smoking on whanau. We do however offer the following recommendations to this policy, both as experts in Maori Public Health and as advocates for the wellbeing of whanau, hapū, iwi and communities.

- We support the intention to stand unapologetically for a smoke free environment that is encompassing of all products, such as tobacco, vapes and 'Heat not Burn' products. We do however recognise that tools such as vaping are extremely effective harm minimisation tools. The latest information released from ASH (Action on Smoking and Health) in the Year 10 survey, shows that those most likely to vape are those who have been smokers, and uptake of vaping is very low as a primary form of 'smoking' for young people. Vaping has also been shown to have no health implications from second hand smoke, and whilst it can be a nuisance, it does not hold the same connotations as tobacco products, and should thus be addressed accordingly. Statistics show that smoking rates have decreased over the past decade, however, the burden of smoking currently sits with Maori and Pacific populations, with Maori being 2.6 times more likely to be a smoker than the non-Maori population, which indicates that the social annihilation for smokers is felt most widely in the Maori community. Such policy needs to be developed in tight collaboration with stop smoking services and we commend the inclusion of such services in the policy.
- The recommend that separate approaches be developed within this policy that allow for the breadth of the landscape on tobacco control and harm minimisation to be explored in full, in order to work towards the greater goal of healthier environments in Kaipara.
- The support section 5 of the policy to have the named areas smoke free, however, we caution the Council regarding the initiation of Smoke free social housing. Given our above-mentioned inequities in smoking rates, the institution of such smoke free policies have the potential to be catastrophic to whanau, who do have smokers. We are concerned about the potential of this policy to disable whanau from obtaining social housing due to their smoking status, and recommend that regulations be in place that ensue that social housing can be enjoyed as a smoke free environment, whilst also ensuring that our most vulnerable populations are not further disadvantaged.
- □ We support and commend the district action plan, particularly the intention to work with Te Ha Oranga o Ngati Whatua, who are leaders and champions of smoke free environments for their won whanau, hapū, iwi and communities. Furthermore, Hāpai te Hauora wishes to extend an invitation to the Kaipara District Council for any support you required across public health policy, advocacy and promotion as well as strategic alignment and community engagement.
- The Commend the Kaipara district council for their valiant efforts to safekeep the lives of our tamariki mokopuna here in the Kaipara, and look forward to seeing the extended efforts of this policy through application in the community setting.

# Submission on the Smokefree Kaipara Policy

Submitted on behalf of: Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua Māori Public Health Unit

- Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua would like to thank the Kaipara District Council for the opportunity to contribute to the discussions in relation to the proposed Smokefree Kaipara Policy.
- 2. As an iwi, Ngāti Whātua's tribal boundaries extend from Ōtāhuhu, in South Auckland,

and extend to Whangarei and Waipoua in the North. The hapū of Ngāti Whātua are Orākei, Te Taoū, Te Uri o Hau and Te Roroa.



- 3. The Rūnanga represents five takiwa:
  - Orākei
  - South Kaipara
  - Otamatea
  - Whangarei
  - Northern Wairoa
- 4. Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua was established in 1988, for the purpose of settling the Treaty claims of the Ngāti Whātua People. Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua is constituted as a body corporate by the Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua Act 1988 and is a Māori Trust Board under the Māori Trust Boards Act 1955.
- 5. Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whātua is the sole representative body and authorised voice to deal with issues affecting the whole of Ngāti Whātua.

- 6. The Māori Public Health Unit strongly supports the goal of a Smokefree Aoteara by 2025.
- 7. We therefore support this proposed Smokefree Kaipara Policy and it's endeavour to contribute to this goal, through attempting to reduce the uptake of smoking and reduce the Kaipara's smoking population.
- 8. We support the Kaipara District Council's aim to support the health and well-being of Kaipara's communities and visitors by reducing the prevalence of smoking, smoking behaviours and the impacts of second-hand smoke.
- 9. The Māori Public Health Unit also supports the three objective of this policy, as outlined below:
  - Contribute to improving the health of residents by reducing the prevalence of smoking and the impacts of second-hand smoke.
  - Reduce the visibility of smoking in public places to positive role model to our children.
  - Deliver Council Leadership and advocate for a smokefree district.
- 10. We believe it is of particular importance to de-normalise smoking for our tamariki by reducing it's visibility, in order to best promote future smoke-free generations.
- 11. We commend the efforts of the Council to work co-operatively with Mana Whenua, alongside other partners, to implement this policy.

- 12. We support the intention to support businesses or organisations that wish to become a smokefree area.
- 13. We commend the efforts of the Council to work with Te Ha Oranga in implementing this policy.
- 14. We support the provision of 'stop smoking support' within the Smokefree Kaipara District Action Plan. We believe that it is vital, amongst our efforts to create a smokefree Kaipara, that we are providing support and opportunities for whānau to access smoking cessation.

### Key Recommedations:

- 15. Within the policy, smoking, vaping and the use of heated tobacco products are all included. Although we support the inclusion of this to eliminate confusion, we believe that parameters should be put in to place to ensure that we are not punishing those who use a vape as a means to quit smoking.
- 16. We also advocate, that if social housing within the Kaipara District are to be smokefree, that parameters are put into place to make sure whānau who smoke are not disadvantaged and turned down from social housing.
- 17. We would like to thank the Kaipara District Council for this opportunity and if the opportunity arises, we would like to orally submit on this matter.



## Q2 Please indicate which age bracket you belong to



## Q3 Do you consider yourself



# Q4 Are you:




# Q5 Do you vape/use an e-cigarette?



Hāpai Te Hauora are national leaders in Population Health, Public Health, Policy and Advocacy, Research and Evaluation, and Infrastructure Services. Our role is to support Māori communities and whānau to play a role in decision-making on matters affecting their health and wellbeing, Iapai affirms the rights to good health and well-being is enshrined in Te Tiriti o Waltangi, and that whānau Māori, hapū, and iwi have the right to good health and well-being. Established as a Tripartite agreement between Te Rünanga o Ngāti Whātua, Tainui and ngā Mātāwaka (Te Whānau o Waipareira) to broker health contracts for the benefit of iwi Māori living within Tāmaki Mākaurau, Hāpai supports actions that uplifts the health and well-being of Māori in alignment with the rights and principles guaranteed to Māori with Te Tiriti o Waitangi. The proposed policy presents some contentious issues regarding the current space that we are asked to navigate in our aspirations towards a Smokefree Aotearoa 2025, and in principla, we support the overarching goals, as we too, have the broad goal of seeing a smokefree Aotearoa, particularly given the inequitable distribution of smoking across the Maori population, as well as the incidental impacts of smoking on whanau. We do however offer the following recommendations to this policy, both as experts in Māori Public Health and as advocates for the wellbeing of whanau, hapū, iwi and communities. "We support the intention to stand unapologetically for a smoke free environment that is encompassing of all products, such as vaping are extremely effective harm minimisation tools. 



# Q10 What public outdoor spaces do you think the Smokefree Kaipara Policy should apply to? (tick all that apply)





#### 1 Background

This Smokefree Kaipara Policy will contribute toward Council's key messages promoting safe and healthy environments and thriving communities. It also supports the goal of a smokefree Aotearoa by 2025 by attempting to reduce the uptake of smoking.

Council adopted a Smokefree Parks and Playgrounds Policy in December 2011. On 30 June 2015, Council signed a Statement of Intent to Support Tupeka Kore Smokefree Tai Tokerau 2025. This statement has the vision that:

'Our children and mokopuna will be free from tobacco/smoke and enjoy tobacco/smokefree lives. At least 95% of the Tai Tokerau population will be smokefree. Tobacco will be expensive to purchase and difficult to access.'

Building on this commitment, Kaipara District Council is providing leadership by increasing smokefree places and facilities throughout the district. Our aim is to support the health and well-being of Kaipara's communities and our visitors by reducing the prevalence of smoking, smoking behaviours and the impacts of second-hand smoke.

To support compliance to this Policy and to eliminate confusion, smoking, vaping (the use of electronic cigarettes) and the use of heated tobacco products (HTP) are included in this Policy. Vaping and the use of HTPs mimic smoking and their emissions can create a nuisance and may result in public confusion and reduced compliance.

Exposure to vaping may act as a trigger for people who have recently quit smoking therefore providing smokefree and vape-free areas is intended to support relapse prevention. The Ministry of Health has stated; the evidence on vaping indicates they carry much less risk than smoking cigarettes but are not risk free.

This Smokefree Kaipara Policy will contribute toward Council's key messages promoting safe and healthy environments and thriving communities. It also supports the goal of a Smokefree Aotearoa by 2025 by attempting to reduce the uptake of smoking and reduce our smoking population.

Councils throughout New Zealand are progressively increasing areas in their districts to be smokefree. These include, for example, parks, playgrounds, sports fields, outdoor dining areas,

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transport hubs, CBDs, beaches, Council-owned buildings and funded events, social housing and other designated public and civic spaces.

Kaipara District Council will work co-operatively with Mana Whenua, the NDHB, the Cancer Society and other partners to implement this Policy.

#### 2 Objectives

This policy aims to work towards the following objectives:

- a) Contribute to improving the health of residents by reducing the prevalence of smoking and the impacts of second-hand smoke.
- b) Reduce the visibility of smoking in public places to positive role model to our children.
- c) Deliver Council leadership and advocate for a smokefree district.

#### 3 Purpose

Kaipara District Council will be proactive and demonstrate leadership by promoting a smokefree lifestyle as being desirable throughout the Kaipara district. Council will send a positive message that our children's health and the environment should be protected from the effects of smoking.

#### 4 Definitions

Council means the Kaipara District Council unless otherwise stated.

**Park** means all land administered by Council for public recreation (regardless of its classification under the Reserves Act 1977 if any) including Council's sports fields and swimming pools.

**Playground** means any Council-administered play equipment such as swings, slides and climbing frames as well as the grounds in which they are sited.

**Smokefree** means to refrain from the smoking of tobacco products, vaping (the use of electronic cigarettes) and the use of heated tobacco products (HTPs).

### 5 Policy Statement

Council will collaborate with partner organisations and agencies to promote Kaipara as a smokefree district, focusing on the benefits of discouraging smoking in public places and reducing environmental litter.

Council will partner with health, local businesses, organisations and agencies to encourage and support any business or organisation that wishes to become a smokefree area.

From 2018 the following areas in the Kaipara district will be smokefree:

- 1 Council-owned parks, playgrounds, sports fields, reserves and skate parks;
- 2 Swimming pool complexes;
- 3 Bus and taxi shelters;
- 4 Beaches:
- 5 <u>Inside social housing;</u>
- 6 All Council-owned buildings and facilities including within four metres of their entranceways, openings and any surrounding outdoor public areas;
- 7 All contractual agreements to hire Council-owned facilities or equipment use are now smokefree;

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- 8 Council funded, run and supported events will be smokefree;
- 9 Outdoor dining areas, where café and restaurant owners or managers voluntarily agree to implement this Policy;
- 10 Council will also investigate designating areas in town centres as smokefree.

#### 6 Implementation

- a) These areas will be promoted as smokefree areas through signage, promotion and marketing.
- b) The Policy will be implemented in unison with a community education and health programme. Resources to support quit smoking will be made readily available throughout the district.

#### 7 Smokefree Kaipara District Action Plan 2018/2021

This action plan identifies specific activities we will do to create a Smokefree Kaipara district in four areas of responsibility:

- a) Around our assets and facilities.
- b) Making our public areas smokefree.
- c) Having smokefree events in our district.
- d) Informing the public of our smokefree goal.

As part of the action plan, Council will work co-operatively with Mana Whenua and partner agencies throughout the district to implement the Policy.
