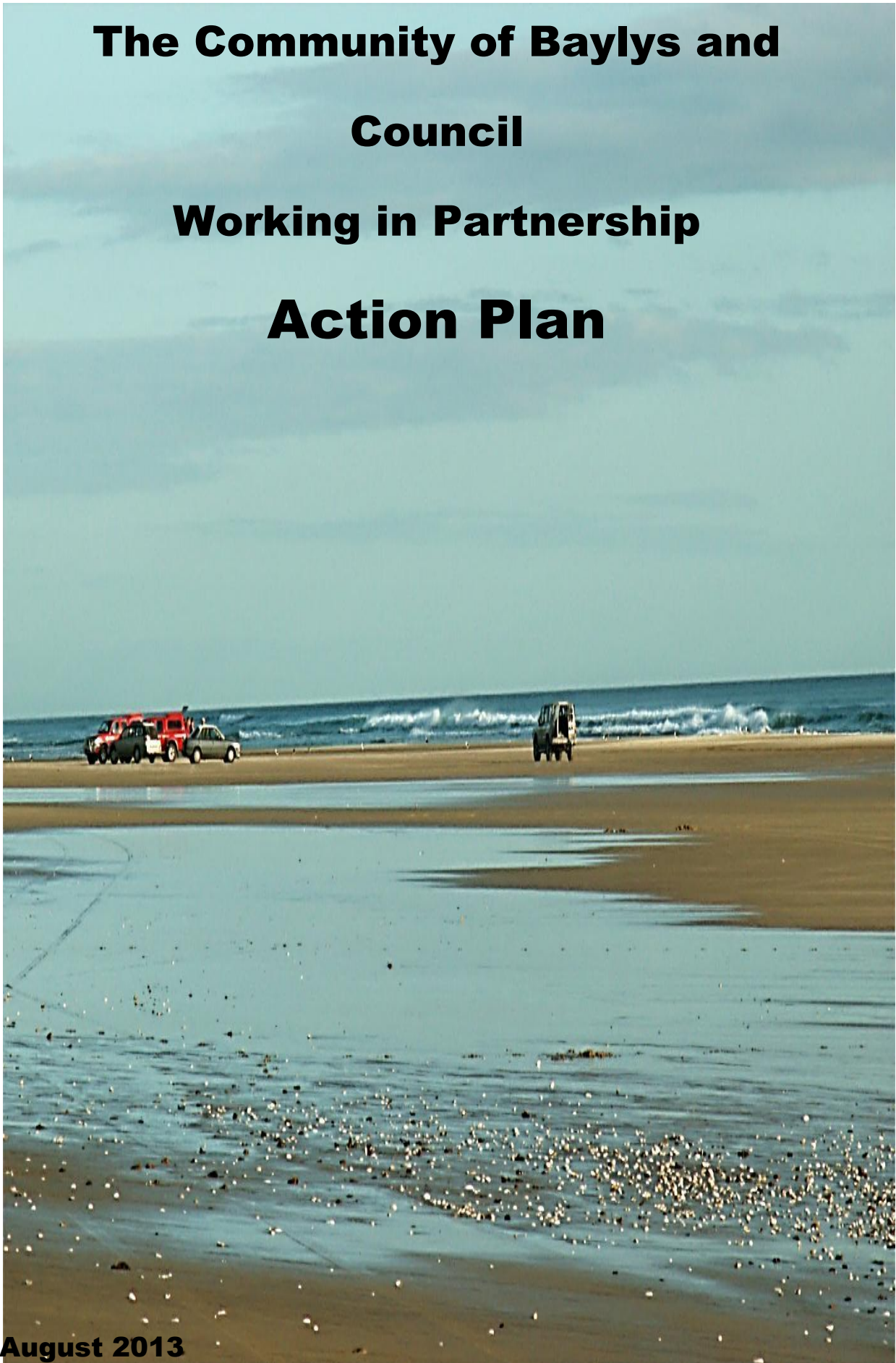

Enhancing Baylys



Priority One ...

The most significant way we can make Baylys better for locals and visitors is to improve access to and use of the beach:

- Modern and accessible toilets
- Improved signage all along the road and at the beach
- Increase ease of car movements
- Widened beach entrance
- Dredged stream
- Mobile shelter for the Surf Club
- Vehicles using the beach behaving more safely for all.

Enhancing Baylys



Priority Two ...

- Traffic is slower e.g. make speed limits clearer by painting '50' on the road
- Rubbish is not an eyesore/nuisance
- Community projects are done by locals e.g. maintain walking tracks.

For another day ...

- Consider the need for a community facility at some time in the future when there is more consensus
- Footpaths would be nice but we can manage without any more for a while yet
- We do not want a wastewater scheme until the environment is really in danger.

	Actions	Timing
Suitable toilets	Investigate whether the existing toilets can be suitably upgraded or whether they need to be replaced (on same site or another site).	Report on Public Toilet Strategy November 2013.
Improved signage	Complete signage plan and consult with community before implementation.	Report back November 2013 with signage plan for consultation.
Increased ease of car movements in the vicinity of the intersection at the foot of Seaview Road	Investigate first, report to community on findings.	Report back November 2013.
Stream dredging included in Maintenance Contract	Completed.	In Contract – on request.
Mobile space for Surf Club	Support funding applications for mobile shelter for beach. Investigate storage facility off-beach.	As and if approached by the Surf Club for assistance.
Safe use of beach by vehicles	Speed limits applied.	12 month process requiring full public consultation.
No rubbish nuisance	Increase cage capacity, remove or disguise?	Report back on options November 2013.
Traffic has slowed down	Paint '50' on road. Investigate slow-points as safety project.	Report back February 2015 – has to be agreed with NZ Transport Agency if Council is to get funding.
Community has its own projects	Help organise if asked. Supply materials.	Community to decide.
