- o The creation of a Precinct over top of the Residentially Zoned land with core provisions that protect ecological features and
- o Apply any necessary consequential amendments to the KDP provisions.

Submission on cats

In Aotearoa/New Zealand we have a plan for the future which was set in place by the government some years ago. The goal of the plan is to achieve a predator-free country by 2050. Ambitious. Strides are being made towards this goal with 27 years still left to achieve it. This is an important vision because we have an exceptional country with many plant and animal species which are unique to us; ie endemic...found nowhere else in the world. In addition we are told by scientists that maintaining diversity in life form is very important for the health of all life on the planet. So let's all get behind this vision.

Numerous conservation organizations have been involved in saving our endemic species for years. This is the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Royal Forest and Bird Society. The Department of Conservation has been hard at work in the business since the late 1980's. Our country has many wildlife sanctuaries - island sanctuaries, fenced and open sanctuaries, and community sanctuaries. In the immediate area surrounding The Rise we can see some of the last mentioned in the form of Marunui and the Bream Tail community. The Piroa Conservation Trust coordinates the work of about 35 conservation groups working in the Piroa/Brynderwyn area. All of these, even DOC, rely on volunteers to help with their work.

Meantime development in many Councils around the country is growing, exponentially in our Mangawhai area. This means more housing and more people encroaching on plants and animals as we take over their habitat. Councils all over the country need to control this growth with their planning which should include consideration of the well-being of endemic wild life. KDC needs to get on board.

This submission relates only to the ownership and management of domestic cats which can be regulated by KDC with the spread of housing to new areas. The Rise is very close to local conservation areas mentioned above where both kiwi and bittern live. The ecologist's report for The Rise identifies fairly common and largely introduced species of avifauna, and indicates that the vegetation and habitat types represented are limited thereby meaning that aquatic creatures, herpetofauna and wetland creatures are also limited. But this 56.9 hectare piece of land lies in the middle of important conservation areas.

At present cats (and dogs) are not permitted in the environmental planted areas of The Rise. Owners are required to do predator control in their covenanted areas. The northern bush remnant bordering Bream Tail Farm is under a conservation covenant. This is all good. However the idea that cats will stay out of the covenanted areas or that their owners can somehow keep them out of these areas is nonsense.

There should be a ban on cats and other pest species, and also monitored control of dogs, at The Rise. I support the Te Uri o Hau submission in this regard. Resident owners should not be put in the invidious position of policing their neighbours who fail to comply with the current requirements for cat/dog ownership in The Rise.

For present resident cat owners at The Rise a change to a ban on cats would be difficult but not impossible to manage. Existing resident cats could be allowed (if neutered, chipped and registered) to live out their lives but not be replaced when they die. KDC would do well to implement the

requirement for neutering, chipping and registering of all cats in their plans as Whangarei District Council has recently done. Alongside this an education programme would help people to transition to new ways of thinking about their pet cats. This would assist in the vision towards a predator free and diverse country.
