Hi Jodi,

Nice to meet you today and to make it clear in no way was I blaming council for the 7 month late archaeological report. I actually think it is disgusting that they had the report since April then lied to council saying they didn't have one then suddenly turn up with one.

The fact that out of all of the reports the only one that had any correct data was about the ground being puggy and clay that is wet and boggy in winter and holding no water to dry and cracked in the summer. We all feel that this is because they couldn't get away with that report as all residents in the area know what the land is like.

Every other report is fabricated to work in their favour to get consent through from the council as they have clearly stated that once they get consent, they then no longer need to apply to council for any thing else they want to do.

Saying no accidents on settlement road, while a resident of settlement rd is in hospital having back surgery due to her accident on the corner of settlement rd and state highway 1. Saying that the entry onto state highway 1 is not a problem. Only taking data of kids being dropped off and picked up and not the 80% of school learning that is done off site, the gymnasium, the marae, after school hour and weekend activities of 100 people or more. All neighbouring farmers confirmed that they are frequently pulling cars out of paddocks and ditches.

The land size is way too small for the amount of students they are expecting even at present it is too small for the 65 to 70 people take all of those going to the toilet 2-4 times a day means a septic would be full in a day or so. Then with soakage fields being under constant use means the first heavy rainfall will take all sewage into neighbouring properties, and as 1 person pointed out the town septic is already at capacity and why should we the rate payers have to pay for the school septic to be hooked into town supply and why should residents that have been waiting miss out. This results in most people not living in our area using our septic

Saying that the 50 decibels of noise which was pointed out the same volume as a heat pump is highly unlikely. So once again a fabricated report to suit their needs.

Then objecting to the councils recommendation of landscaping to act as noise and visual blockage from the school saying that it is not required.

The lies that we are being told from Tonkin Taylor and the ministry of education is getting out of hand

We are asking the council, please can correct reports with verified and fact checked data be presented correctly.
